

General Information

We would like to welcome all MTBO teams to the region of Skåne in the south of Sweden. The second round of the MTBO World Cup is organized in conjunction with the biggest orienteering event in the world: O-Ringen. O-Ringen celebrates its 50th anniversary in 2014 and is returning to Skåne where it once started.

1. Event location



How to get to Kristianstad

Kristianstad is easily accessible by plane, train, bus or car.

Airports:

- Copenhagen International Airport (CPH), Denmark, 130 km from Kristianstad
- Malmö airport (swedavia.se/malmo) is a big airport about 100 km from Kristianstad with flights from Stockholm operated by SAS and Norwegian.
- Kristianstad Österlen Airport (kidairport.com) in Everöd, 15 km from the Event Center, can be reached from Stockholm Arlanda.

Trains:

There is a direct train (www.sj.se) from Copenhagen Airport to Kristianstad (1 h 25 min.). Hässleholm is one stop before Kristianstad (1 h 05 min. from the airport).

Öresundståg (www.oresundstag.se/en/Start) is the traffic system for travelling in Skåne.

Taking your bike on the train is usually no problem, please see http://www.oresundstag.se/en/Fares--Conditions/Ticket-types/How-to-travel-with-bike

Travelling by car:

It's easy to travel by car to Kristianstad. Road E22 passes Kristianstad.





4. Venue and embargoed areas

Overview



Embargoed areas



The areas marked on the map above are embargoed for all orienteering activities, unless specifically permitted by the organizers and the IOF Senior Event Adviser. The embargoed areas are out of bounds for all potential participants and team members, including competitors, team leaders, coaches, doctors, escorts, and any other person who through their knowledge of the terrain may influence the result of the competitions. This means:

- no organized orienteering activity may take place in the area,
- no training sessions may take place in the area,
- no one with potential connection to a team (athletes or others) may visit the area with a map.

The town and the area of Kristianstad are restricted for MTBO activity. They are open for pedestrians, cars and leisurely cycling without a map, but it is strictly forbidden to cycle with the intention to test route choices.

Event Center

The Event Center is at O-Ringen Town, which is located at Norra Åsum, some kilometers south of Kristianstad. Distances to and from the Event Center are shown in chapter 10 'Transport'.

Remarks:

- The start of the Open Competitions will be as soon as possible after the World Cup races.
- There will be no banquet.

6. Classes and participation restrictions

World Cup

There is one class for women (W21) and one for men (M21). There are no age restrictions. The maximum number of competitors for each individual competition is 6 men and 6 women per federation.

7. Competition Rules

Round 2 of the World Cup 2014 will be organized in accordance with the *Competition Rules for IOF MTB Orienteering Events* as published by the IOF and valid from January 1, 2014, the *Special Rules for the 2014 World Cup in MTB Orienteering* and the *IOF Anti-Doping Rules* valid from February 1, 2010.

All competition rules can be found on the IOF web site www.orienteering.org.

- Competitors must get to all control points with their bikes.
- Riding off the track or trail is not allowed.
- In Sweden one drives on the right side of the road. Therefore competitors must ride on the right side on all roads and tracks.

Deviation from the Competition Rules

The start interval at the Long distance will be 2 minutes in the men's class. This rules deviation has been approved by the IOF Council.



Time keeping system

SPORTident will be used at all competitions.

Doping

Doping is strictly forbidden, and the organizers of the World Cup 2014 in Sweden are dedicated to supporting the anti-doping authorities in their work.

Doping controls may be carried out any time during the competition period. As some sites for the doping controls may be a few minutes' drive away, we suggest that athletes are prepared at all competitions to take along some dry clothes to change into after their race.

Doping tests are always carried out in accordance with the procedures described in the WADA International Standard of testing. The IOF Anti-Doping Code and rules apply as of February 1, 2010.

Athletes who are selected for the doping tests must bring an official identification (with photo) to the doping test area. Accreditation cards with photo can also be used for this purpose. The athletes should bring along their therapeutic use exemption (TUE) if applicable. In general, it is advisable that the athletes bring along their ID to all the competitions and events.

8. Entry

World Cup competitors may only be entered by their federation.

Entries can only be made via the entry forms which can be found on the organizer's website www.oringen.se/worldcup: form A for preliminary entry, form B for final entry.

Deadlines

Preliminary entry by April 1, 2014 giving:

- country
- number of competitors of each gender
- number of team officials
- team manager's name, address and email address, telephone number

Final entry by July 1, 2014 giving:

- country
- each competitor's family name and first name, year of birth, gender, class and IOF ranking ID which can be found on http://iofranking.osport.ee/iofranking/Athletes
- family name and first name of the team officials
- information on whether the competitor borrows an SI-card or uses his/her own SI-card

Late entries may be refused or an additional fee of 50 % may be charged.

All entry fees must reach the organizer by July 1, 2014. Competitors or teams may be excluded if their entry fee is not paid.

9. Accommodation

Accommodation around Kristianstad is difficult to find as there is a beach handball tournament taking place at the same time, and at O-Ringen more than 20 000 participants are expected.

Booking of the accommodation offered by the organizer is only possible via the accommodation booking form which can be found on the organizer's website www.oringen.se/worldcup.

After booking your accommodation you will be informed if your desired accommodation is available (first come, first served basis). Your booking becomes only valid when a payment of 50 % of the total amount has been received. Full payment for accommodation must be made by July 1 to the account mentioned in chapter 11 'Payments').

Deadline for booking the organizer's accommodation: April 1 or later

10. Transport

There are good public transport connections to Kristianstad (see chapter 1). Transport from Kristianstad train station to the Event Center can be arranged upon request (extra cost). There is a train service from Kristianstad to Hässleholm (about 20 minutes).

Training, Model Event and all competitions are within a short distance (max. 33 km) from the Event Center (see below).

Event Center – Kristianstad Train Station: 5 km Event Center – Training (Degeberga): 20 km Event Center – Model Event (Åhus Norra): 15 km Event Center – Middle distance (Äspet): 17 km Event Center – Sprint (Kristianstad): 5 km

Event Center - Long distance (Bockeboda): 12 km

Event Center - Hässleholm (accommodation and training): 33 km

13. Local weather conditions

In the south of Sweden the temperatures during the day are usually as follows in July: average temperature = 20° C, maximum temperature = 25° C, minimum temperature = 15° C. More information about the local weather conditions can be found at www.smhi.se.

15. Terrain description and courses



Middle distance

Coast terrain with open pine forest and sand dunes. Flat to moderately hilly. A dense track network consisting of small paths with mostly good rideability, although some sandy sections may challenge riders.


Estimated winning time: 55 - 60 minutes

Sprint

Urban area with generally paved tracks. A mix between streets and park terrain. The pace will be high and riders will have to deal with several types of orienteering challenges.

Estimated winning time: 20 - 25 minutes





Long distance

An area used for mountain biking, cross country running and -skiing, making a network of tracks with all sorts of rideability. Mostly flat with some smaller climbs and ascents. Vegetation ranges from open beech forest to dense coniferous woods. Some rough areas due to storm damage.

Estimated winning time: 105 - 115 minutes

 Detailed information on course length, total climb and number of controls on each course will be available in Bulletin 4.



The Long distance course will have butterflies in the men's and women's class.

Payment

- Competitors from Swedish clubs will be billed afterwards.
- Foreign competitors must pay the entry fee in cash in SEK (Swedish crowns) or by credit card before the start.



Deadline for entry: July 1, 2014

Entry on the day of the competition is possible, but maps are only available as long as stock lasts.

Start times and start lists

The first start of the open competitions will be as soon as possible after the World Cup races (see chapter 5 'Program'). Individual start, but there will be no start lists; participants start within a given time frame.
